How do we read?

We read in many different places, for example, in a park, on a bus etc. This is because books, newspapers, magazines are easy to carry. We also read in many different ways, and at different speeds.

Sometimes we read quickly. We just want to get the general idea from a newspaper article, a report, or a book. Perhaps we want to know what it is about, or if it is interesting or crucial to know. We call this type of reading 'skimming'. _____ such as a date, a telephone number, or the name of a restaurant. This is called 'scanning'. We scan timetables, telephone directories, dictionaries, and web pages.

At other times we need to read more carefully. For example, we read a textbook, an article, or a report to understand everything. This is called 'intensive reading' or 'study reading'. Then we read slowly and check the meaning. We use our dictionaries a lot to help us. Perhaps we take notes and try to remember things. Sometimes we need to learn things by heart, for example, a poem, or a mathematical equation. Sometimes we read to have a good time – perhaps as extra research, or only for interest. We concentrate, but we do not worry about details. This is 'extensive reading'.

All in all, we read different kinds of texts in different ways. The reasons why we read are important because they help us decide how to read the text. Learning to read effectively a skill that everybody should have in order to excel at life.
